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Section 1: Governance: a) Strategy b) Roles & Responsibilities c) Meeting arrangements etc.

- a) The strategy for the forthcoming year was agreed to focus on two aspects: Construction Quality Knowledge and Construction Quality Professional Training. This was considered to be sufficient for this year. [No Change]
- b) A new Group has been set up to examine and develop professional training for Construction Quality Professionals.
- c) It was agreed that the Article Guide would be used for all new articles. [No Change]

Section 2: Update from Chairperson on key matters from Steering Committee

1) The Steering Group has been focussed on CPD events. There had been good feedback from the most recent event (see below).

Section 3: Update from Chairperson on key matters relevant to the Chartered Quality Institute

- 1. There was no formal update from the CQI.
- 2. The London Branch will be holding an event at the CQI in Furnival Street on Thursday 21 March starting at 18:30. The topic is "The Importance of Information Security and How it Can Reduce Business Risk".

Section 4: Update from other CWG Workstreams

1) No update.

Section 5: Update from other ConSIG Working Groups

- 1) WG-01 "Cost of Quality": The Group is still looking for organisations who undertake long-term maintenance and have experience in collecting data on defects. Insurance companies have also been approached.
- 2) WG-02 "Common Defects" .
 - a. Their work continues to correlate various organisations' "Common Defects Books" to form one single book that can be accessed by all companies on line. A reference to their output will be placed on our website in due time. [No Change]
 - CIRIA are to set up a book of defects related to concrete. There is a Contractor undertaking the task has pulled out. CIRIA may be looking to the CQI for support. They are also looking for support from the Concrete Institute (among others). MB to provide introductions, where appropriate. [ACTION MB]
 - c. Network Rail have set up a working group to consider how to compile a book of defects related to the rail industry.
- 3) WG-04 "Contract Quality Standards": This is a new working group that will concentrate on methods for introducing standard wording into construction contracts with respect to quality management.[No Change]
- 4) WG-05 "Construction Quality Professional Training". Several workshops have been held, the results of which are to be presented to the Steering Committee today (06 Mar 19). The training will be in modular form, so that participants can pick and choose the ones that are relevant to their development.

Four levels have been tentatively set—Foundation, Intermediate, Advanced and Expert. These have been correlated with PCQI, MCQI and FCQI professional status. It should be noted that these modules will either be replacements for, or additions to, the existing CQI qualifications.

The training will also aligned with the criteria stated in the CQI Competence Framework. To date, the Group has concentrated specifically on the Intermediate and Advanced levels. This is as agreed with the Steering Committee as it is recognised to be priority need.

It was noted it is believed the MCQI criteria do not specify the number of years that are required for admission, although a minimum of two years is commonly expected.

The Foundation one- or two-day course will provide a Construction Quality-centric orientation and is designed for those entering the profession.

It was noted that the earlier levels were more related to the practical aspects of Quality, whilst the upper level courses covered the management / leadership of Quality, together with the softer aspects of management / leadership. More senior persons moving from an industry outside construction would probably consider joining these upper levels, picking the modules that they would need in their new role.

Section 6: Events Information

1) The Events Programme is to be discussed further during the next ConSIG Steering Committee. [No Change]

 The event (EFQM Excellence Model in Construction) that took place on 13th of February 2019 at the Balfour Beatty building in Canary Wharf received good reports through feedback. 9a: Tracker: (a) Review of statistics b) Review of Programme c) Article List

- 1) The scheme for reviewing articles was discussed. Two stages were agreed:
 - a. The author and reviewer would come to a decision that the article was in a fit condition technically.
 - b. A Review Panel would examine the article for readability and sense from the point of view of the reader. Technical matters would not be questioned, unless they were obvious errors. The members of the Review Panel were not expected to be technical experts.
- 2) The status report showed that
 - a. 18 articles had been published, together with 2 templates.
 - b. Around 26,000 hits had been made on Designing Buildings Wiki.
- 3) TH will host the documents on the Google Drive and will provide access as necessary. Care will be taken to prevent two people accessing the same document at the same time to prevent parallel development.
- 4) Actions were taken on the articles highlighted in red as follows:
