2 Update from Chairperson on key matters from Steering Committee

- 2.1 The ConSIG AGM will take place Wednesday 4th December 2019. [Confirmed]
- 2.2 Fifteen persons have volunteered to develop the ConSIG NextGen network.
- 2.3 The Steering Committee needs to consider planning and executing events. [No change]
- 2.4 There is a move to update the governance of the ConSIG.
- 2.5 The ConSIG newsletter has been published and sent by email to members.

3 Update from Chairperson on key matters relevant to the Chartered Quality Institute

- 3.1 The Quality Day presentation has been hosted on the website
- 3.2 Work is being undertaken to correlate the requirements for MCQI to the relevant NVQ levels required under the CSCS scheme. Once complete, it will automatically permit members and above to apply for an "Academically Qualified Person" card, following satisfactory completion of the "Managers and Professionals" test.

4 Update from other ConSIG Working Groups

4.1 WG-01 "Cost of Quality":

JM has met with the NHBC in support of WG-01. It is hoped that they have a statistically significant sample of defect data that can be used to set up the database.

4.2 WG-02 "Common Defects".

With the return of the developer, work on the website will resume.

4.3 Measuring Quality Performance Working Group (GIRI) [provided by GA]

A sub-committee has been set up to be an approved trainer or to use a GIRI-assessed external trainer. The supervisor's course has gone well. GA provided a copy of the GIRI brochure. (attached to the email delivering these minutes)

4.4 WG-04 "Contract Quality Standards":

This is still in the initial investigation stages.

4.5 WG-05 "Construction Quality Professional Training".

The course has been developed by Nina Batty and will be prototyped on 24/25th Nov 19 with ConSIG personal and others for review and discussion. Participants will be required to follow all protocols strictly.

8 Construction Quality Knowhow

8.1 Article production

8.1.3 Articles that have been Published

No articles have been published since the previous meeting:

- 8.1.4 Articles for Steering Committee Approval
 - a. <u>Accreditation of Certification Bodies.</u> The revised version was accepted for submission to the Steering Committee [ACTION TH]
 - b. Quality Management Systems. GT reviewed the two articles and considered that both should be hosted. The reason was that the existing article described the mechanics of a QMS, whilst the new article reflected the sociological aspects of introducing Quality into a management system. TH is to alter the title to "Quality Management Systems (QMS) Beyond Documentation and submit it to the Steering Committee. No further review was considered necessary. [ACTION TH]
 - c. Cost of Quality. The article is to be submitted to the Steering Committee with a request to John Adshead to take a close look. [ACTION TH]
- 8.1.5 Articles with Comments following ConSIG CWG Review
 - a. <u>Mechanical and Electrical Contracting.</u> BD has considered the review comments. After some discussion, it was agreed that reference should be made back to the Article Guide which may, in itself, require re-assessment. This should lead to presentation of a revised article. [ACTION BD]
- 8.1.6 Articles for ConSIG CWG Panel Review
 - a. <u>Lean Construction.</u> The document has been written by Stuart Anwyl and reviewed by Tony Blanch. Jim Taylor-Rose has been asked to act as a second reviewer. There has been no response yet from JT-R. [ACTION MB]
- 8.1.7 Articles in the Pipeline
 - a. <u>Defects Management/Control of Non-Conformity.</u> This article is under peer review. Revised date to be advised. [ACTION MB/IM/PE/CH]. [No change]
 - b. <u>Checklists.</u> Luca Fiderio to write and Keith Hamlyn to review. Date to be advised. [ACTION LF/KH] [No change]
 - c. <u>Benchmarking</u>. Author has been confirmed as Jon Adshead. MB to review. Date to be advised subject to JA's other commitments. [ACTION JA/MB] [No change]
 - d. <u>Temporary Works Design.</u> KR has been confirmed as author with KH as reviewer. Anticipated for review by KH at end of November 2019. [ACTION KR/KH] [No change]
 - e. <u>Checking and Approval in Design.</u> KR has been confirmed as author with TH and KH as reviewers. This article is expected at the end of December 2019. [ACTION KR/TH/KH] [No change]
 - f. <u>Building Control and Regulations.</u> PE has been confirmed as author. [ACTION PE] GT will ask Anna Thompson if she would be willing and able to review [ACTION GT]
 - g. Rail. The author and reviewers are to be defined. KH to keep liaising with MD and others in Network Rail. [ACTION KH] [No change]
 - h. MB will be reviewing the ITP article, How to write an ITP and the ITP template for currency [ACTION MB]
 - Adam Rumens will be reviewing the article on lifts and escalators for currency. A decision will be made as to whether or not the articles should be split into two, one for each topic. [ACTION AR]
 - j. Adam Rumens has volunteered to produce an article on 'Air passenger boarding bridges' and David Myers has agreed to be reviewer. [ACTION AR/DM]
 - k. The Article Guide for "Off-Site Manufacturing" was reviewed. Changes were suggested. These will be incorporated and resubmitted to the Working Group for approval. [ACTION KH]

9 Any other business

9.1 TH will retire from his role later this year. The hunt for a volunteer is still on-going. [No change]



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9.2 Artificial Intelligent software used by DBW has identified a number of concepts within the ConSIG articles which have not been explained but have appeared in articles without an explanation of what the term meant. HB agreed to look at the list and propose some suitable short definitions. It was agreed that definitions from ISO specifications, such as ISO 9000, should be the first port of call. [ACTION HB] [MB to chase. [ACTION MB] [No change]

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Accreditation of Conformity Assessment (Certification) Bodies


Summary

Conformity Assessment or Certification Bodies hold registers of organisations that they have audited and have been shown to conform to the requirements of one or more internationally recognised specifications, such as ISO 9001.

National Accreditation Bodies provide recognition that a Conformity Assessment Body is conducting itself in a manner that demonstrates competence and impartiality in undertaking registration of organisations. A list of National Accreditation Bodies can be found at:

National Accreditation Bodies hold lists of the Conformity Assessment Bodies they have accredited which can be used to confirm that they really have been accredited.



** (UK organisations only shown. There are equivalents in many other countries.

This diagram shows the relationships between the various entities and the opportunities for verifying conformity.

Purchasers of goods or services can gain confidence when procuring from a supplier that has been registered by an Accredited Conformity Assessment Body that its management system is operating in accordance with the specification(s) as stated on its certificate with the result that the goods and/or services will meet requirements. Confirmation should be obtained that the registration covers the scope of work, product or material to be supplied. The evidence leading to that confidence may not be as strong where a Non-Accredited Conformity Assessment Body has been employed by the organisation and may lead to unforeseen risk to delivery of goods or services. Purchasers can confirm that the supplier has been formally registered to the appropriate standard with an accredited Conformity Assessment Body by referring to the National Accreditation Body website for its list of accredited Conformity Assessment Bodies.

Organisations selecting Conformity Assessment Bodies to register their organisations should review the Chartered Quality Institute policy on the use of Non-Accredited Conformity Assessment Bodies, which is to avoid them. This can be found at:
